He has been there for more than 45 years. Rick joined The Drifters in 1966 as a singer and recorded with the group on Atlantic Records through the early 1970s. During that time, he toured with The Drifters throughout the world and shared stages with some of the greatest names in music and show business. You can look it up in books and anthologies chronicling The Drifter's history. Rick Sheppard is prominently featured among the many singers.

## RICK SHEPPARD'S DRIFTER'S

In the late 1960s, George Treadwell, the manager of The Drifters, sought a replacement for the late lead singer Rudy Lewis. Persuaded by songwriter Rose McCoy and Bert Burns, Treadwell reached out to Rick Sheppard in 1966.

Initially, Rick thought it was a prank and hung up. After McCoy confirmed the legitimacy of the call, Treadwell reassured Rick, leading to his acceptance of the role as the new lead singer of The Drifters and the rest is as they say is Rock' n' Roll History!
